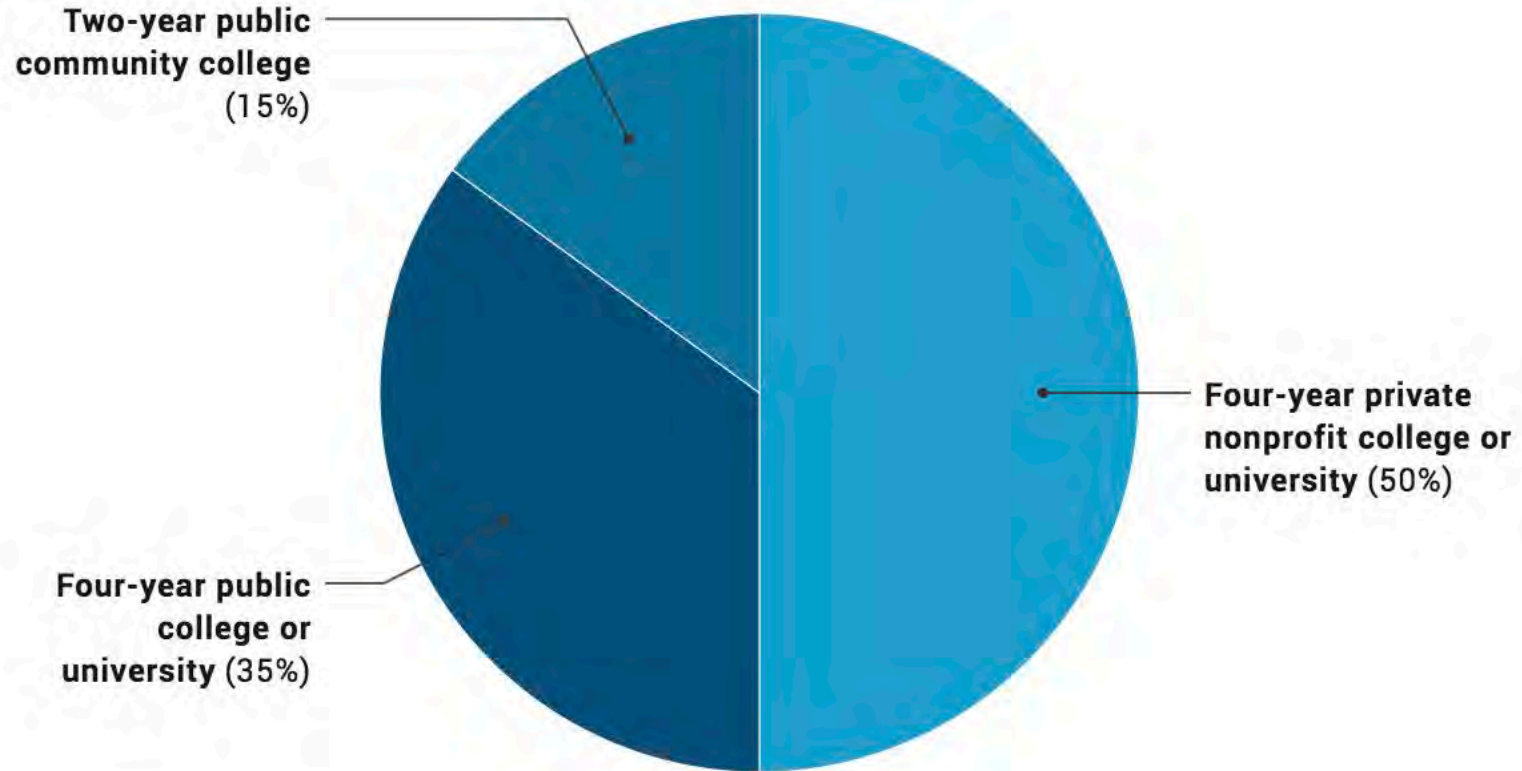

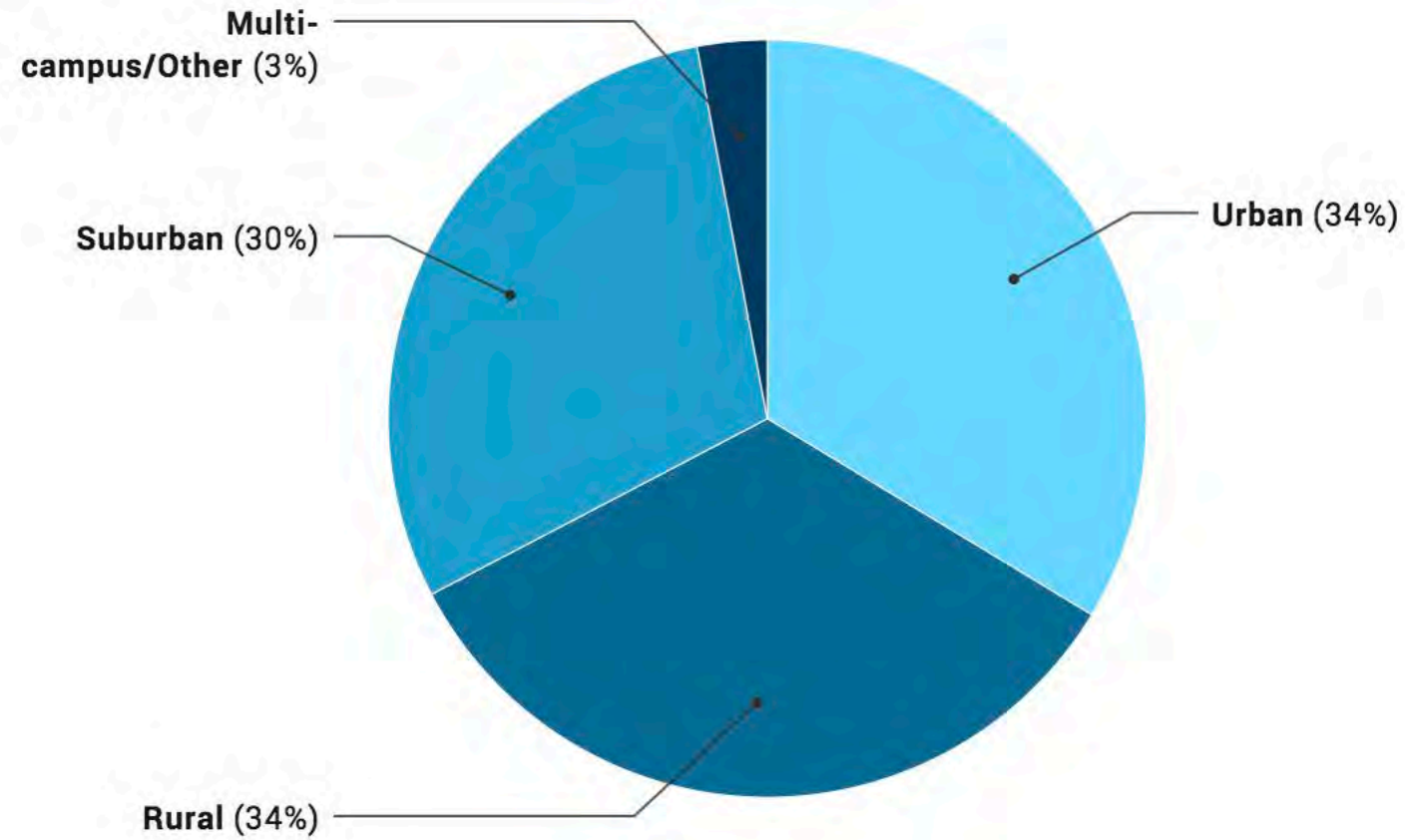

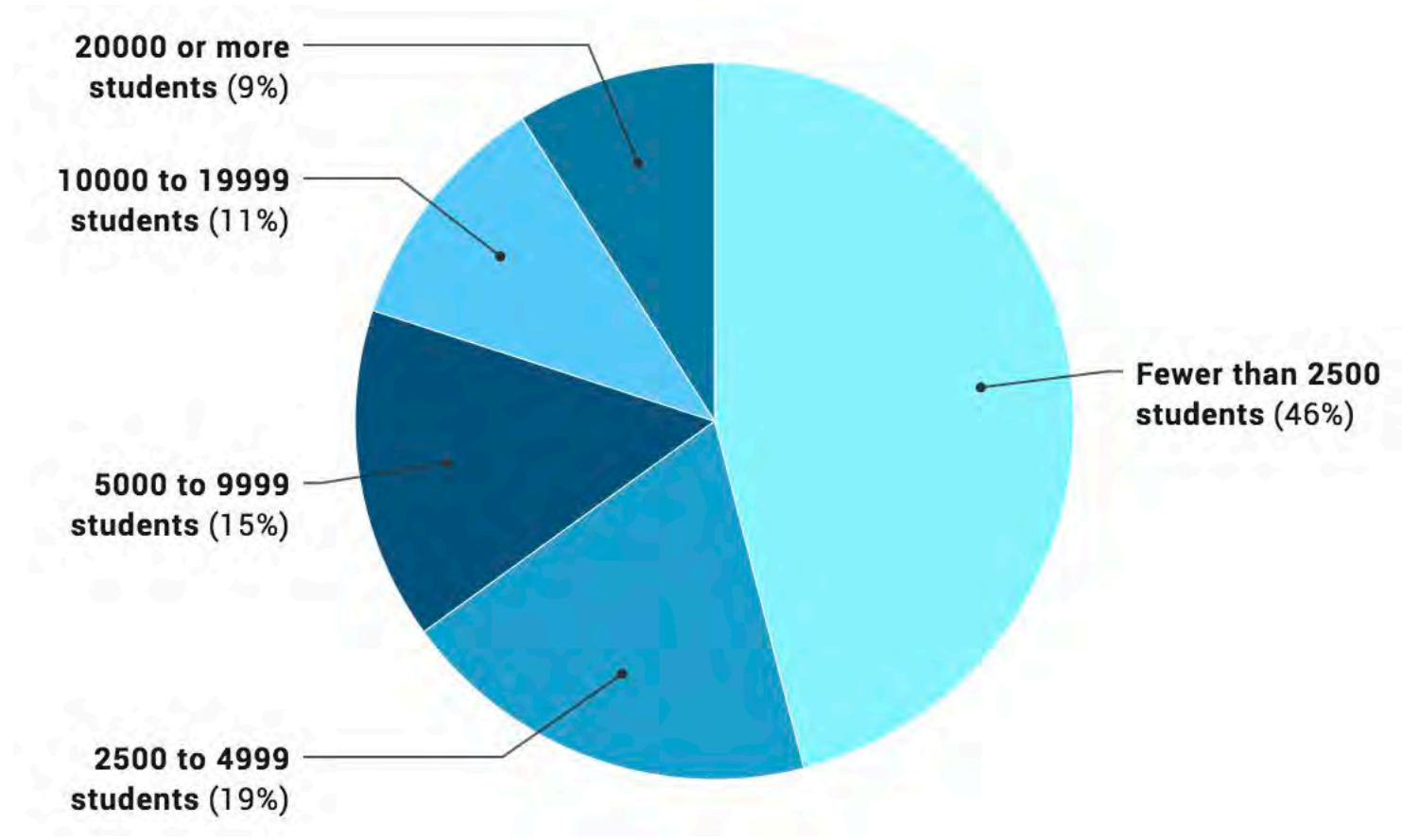

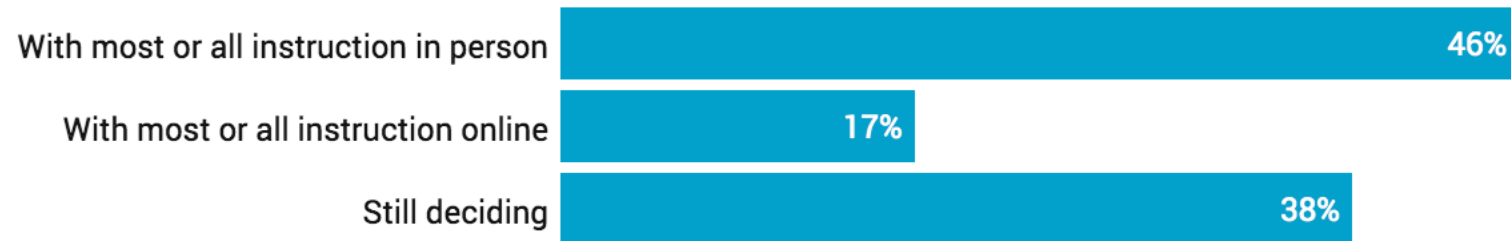
Which of the following actions has your institution taken or considered in response to the outbreak of Covid-19?





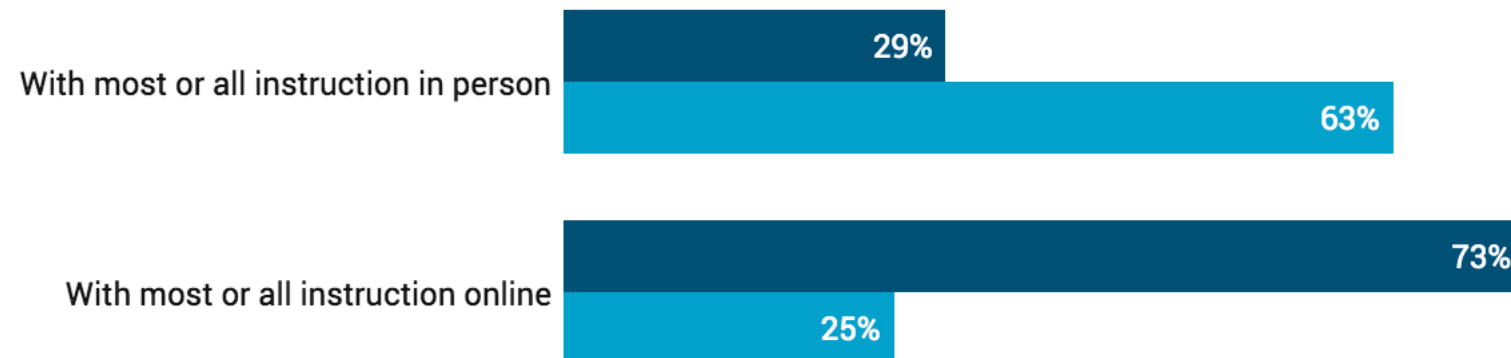

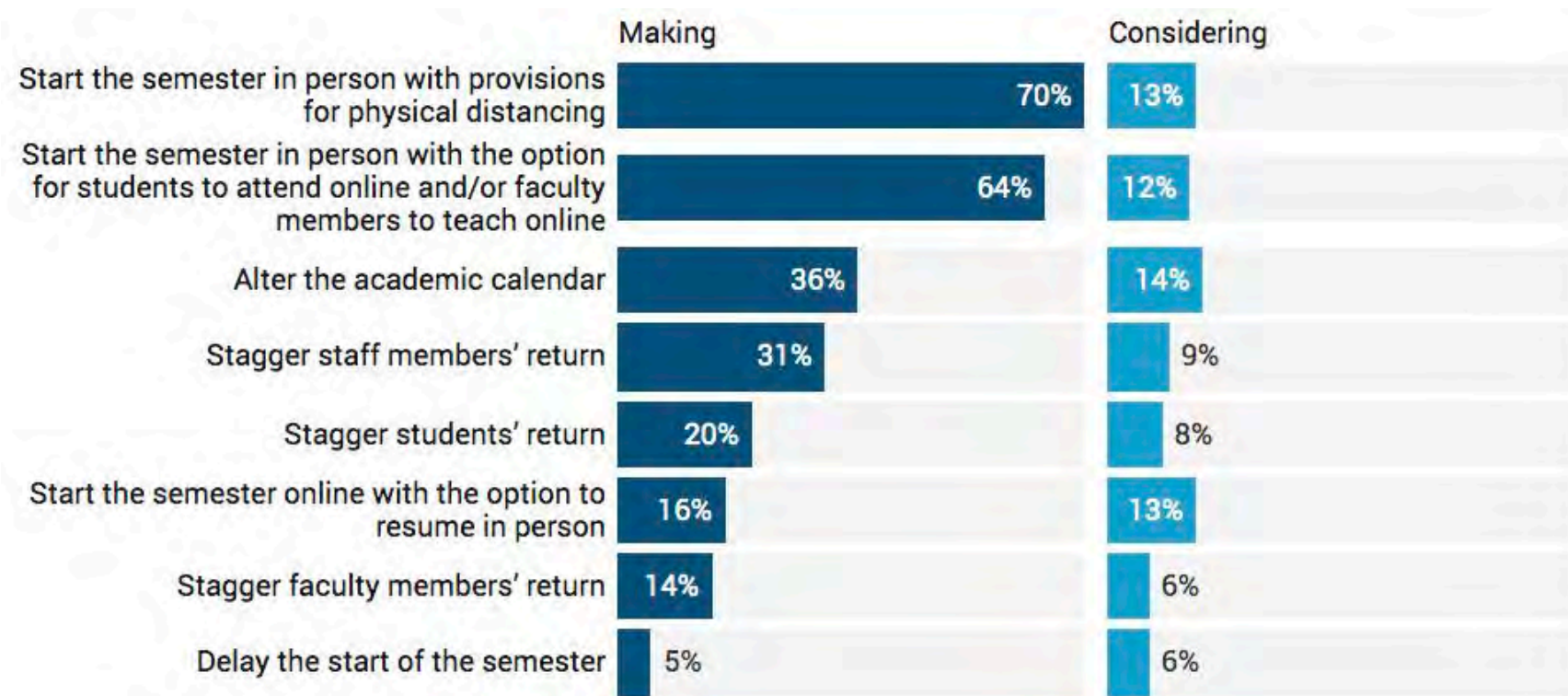

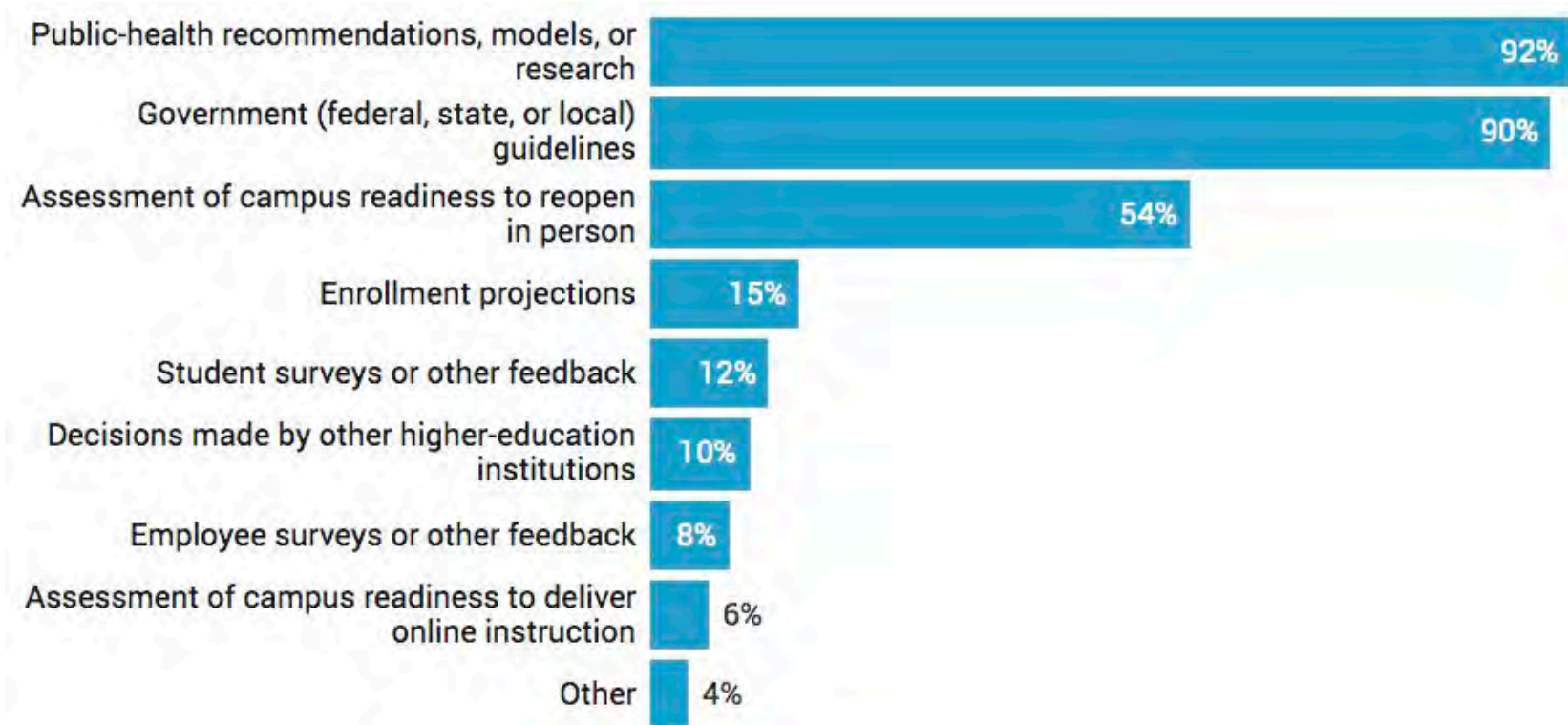
What adjustments to the fall semester is your institution making or considering?

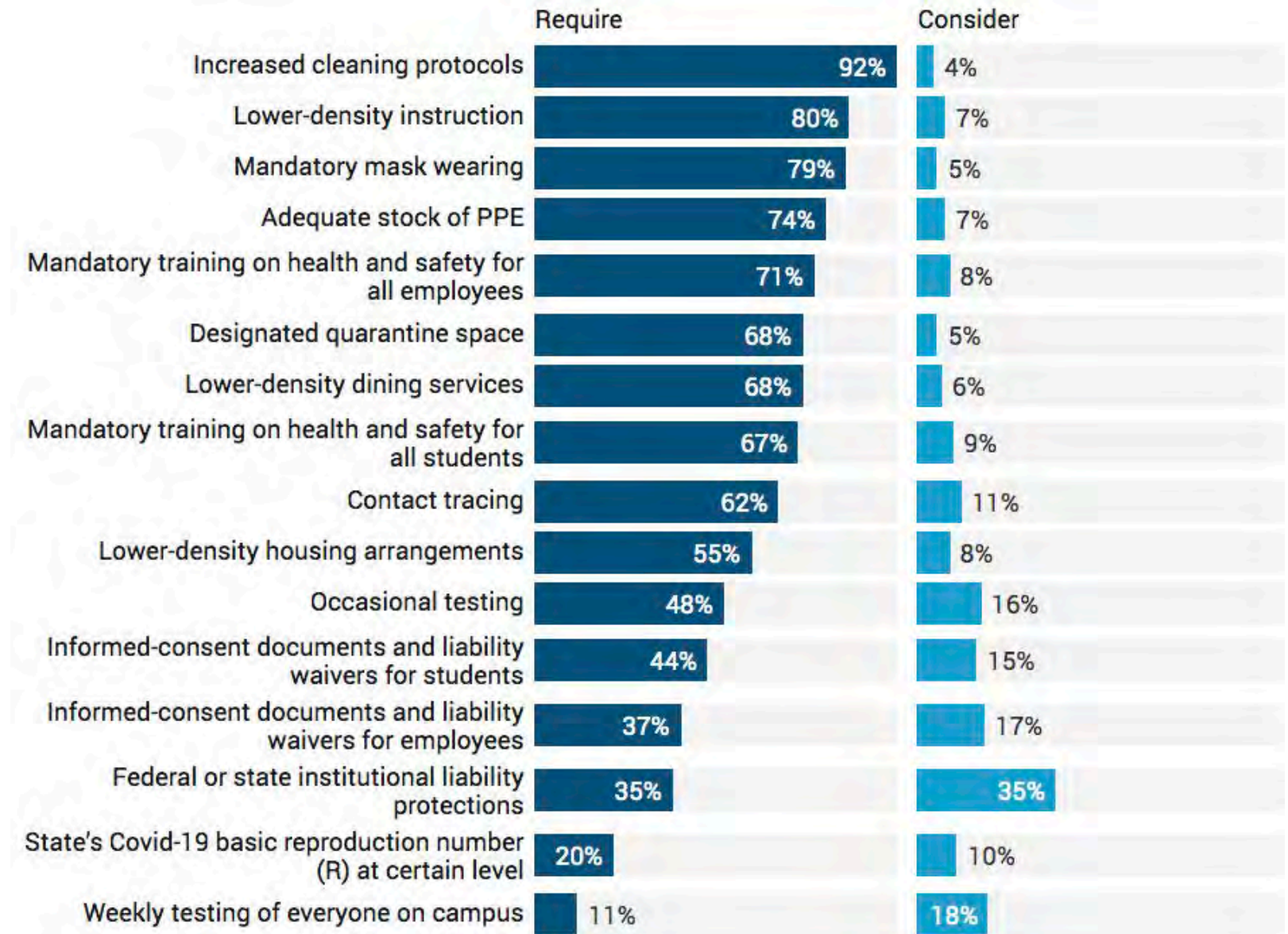
Which factors are in the top three in your decision-making?





Necessary Conditions

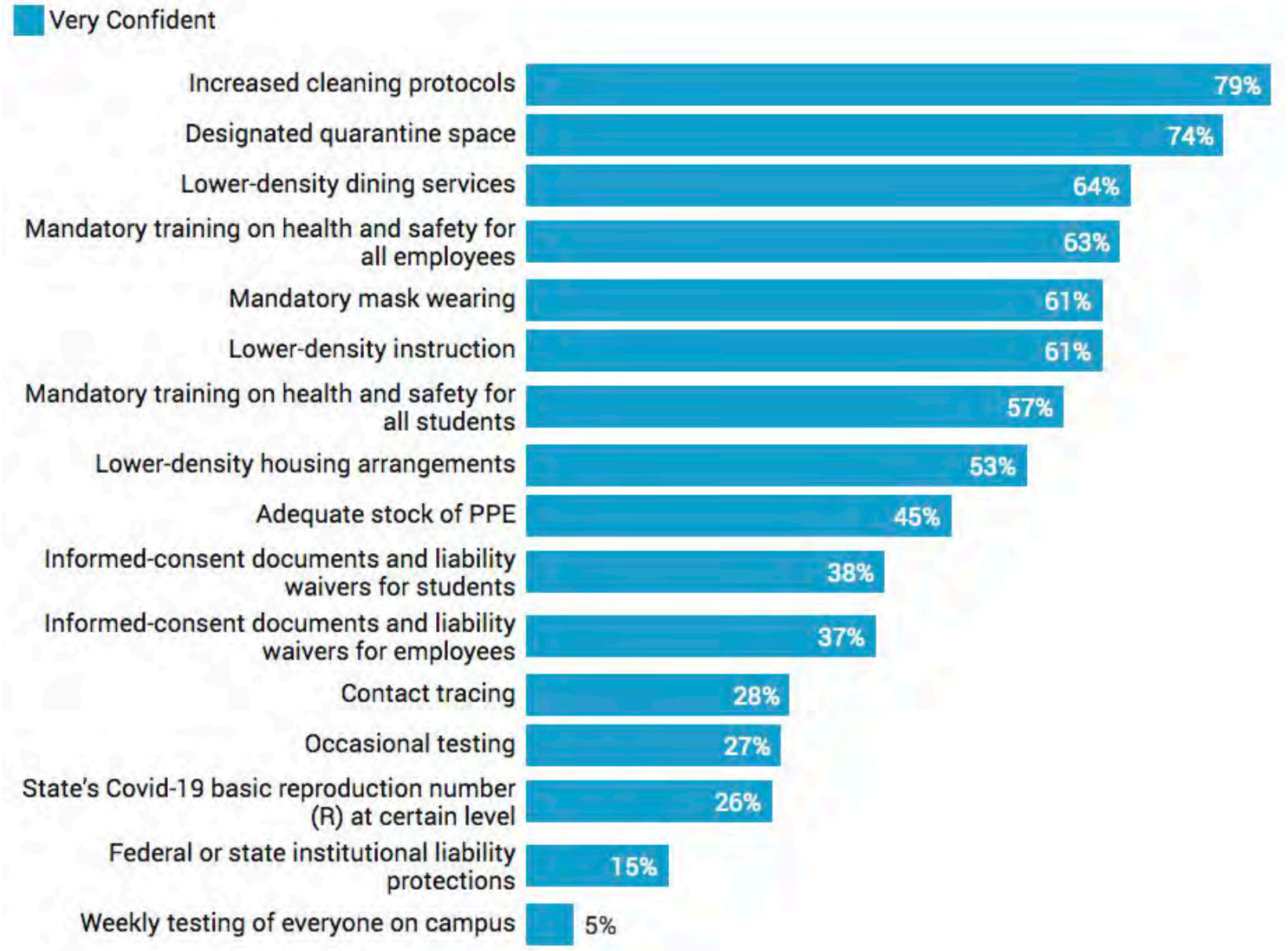
Which conditions would you require or consider for reopening in person?





Confidence Level

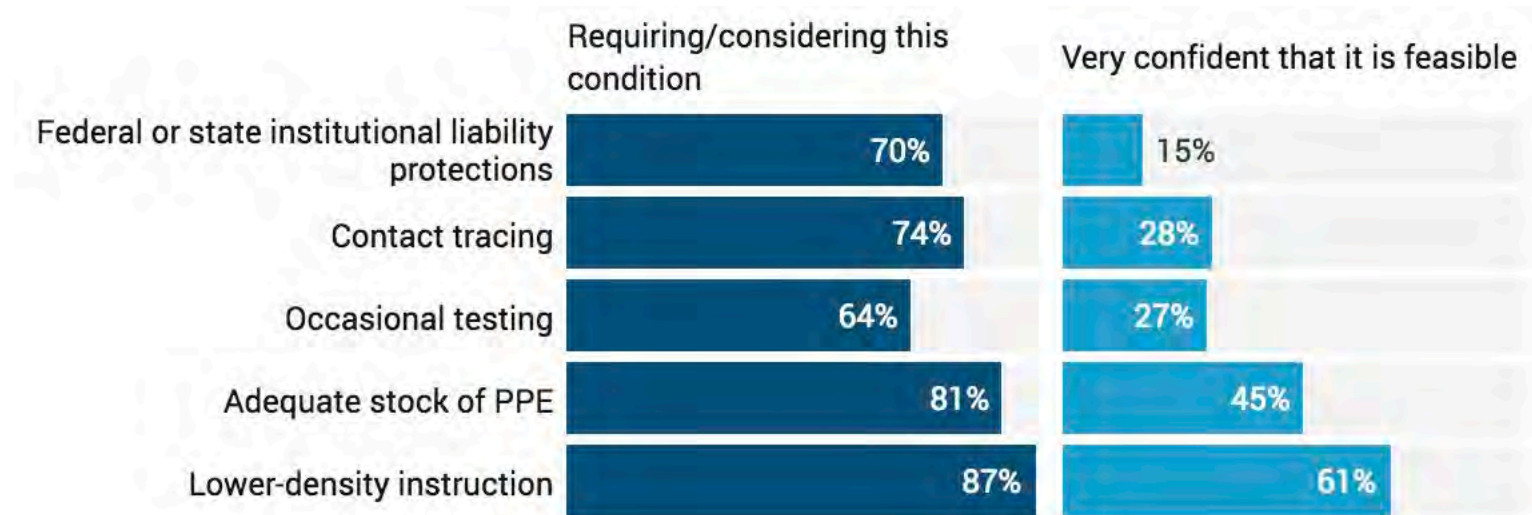
Of the conditions you would require or consider for reopening in person, how confident are you that they are feasible?

Estimated Cost

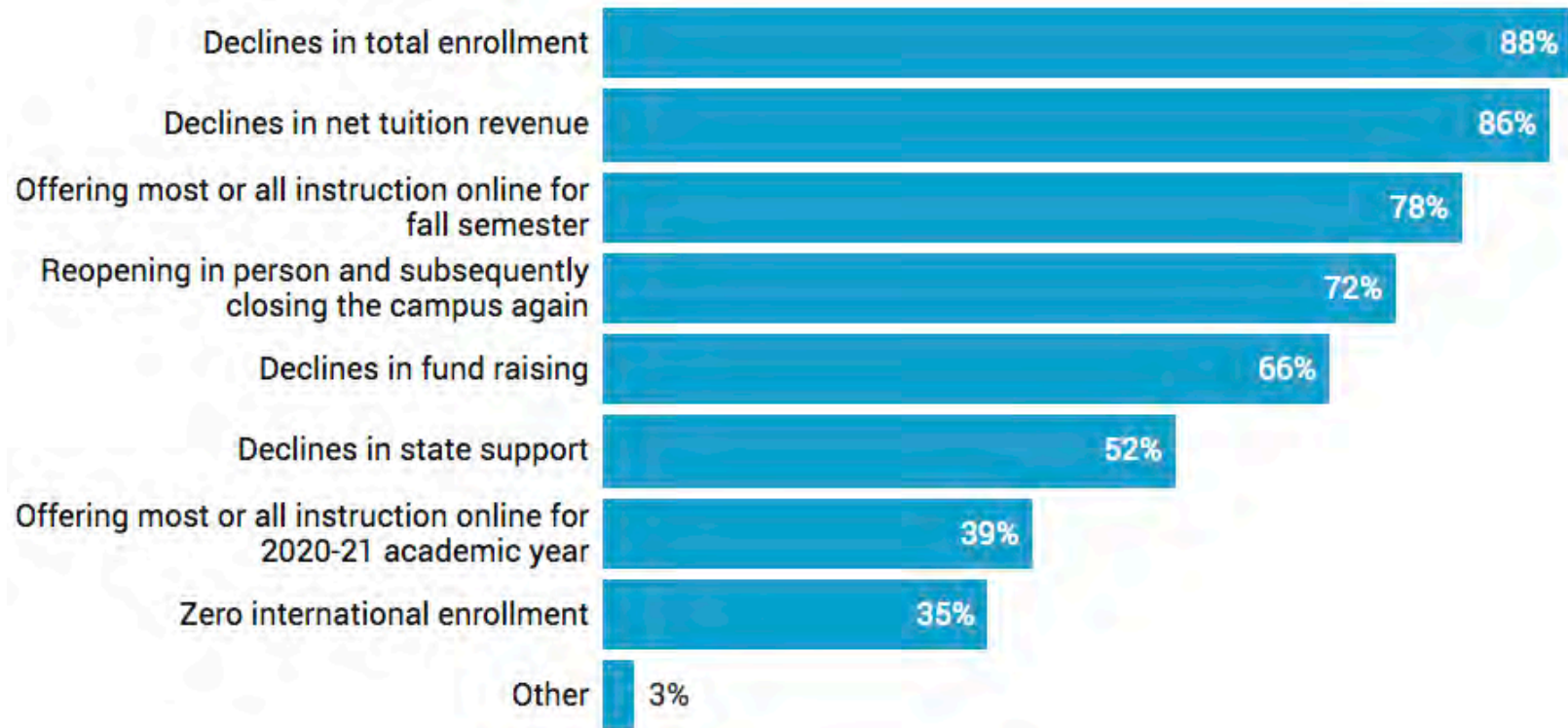
Of the conditions you would require or consider for reopening in person, have you estimated the cost?

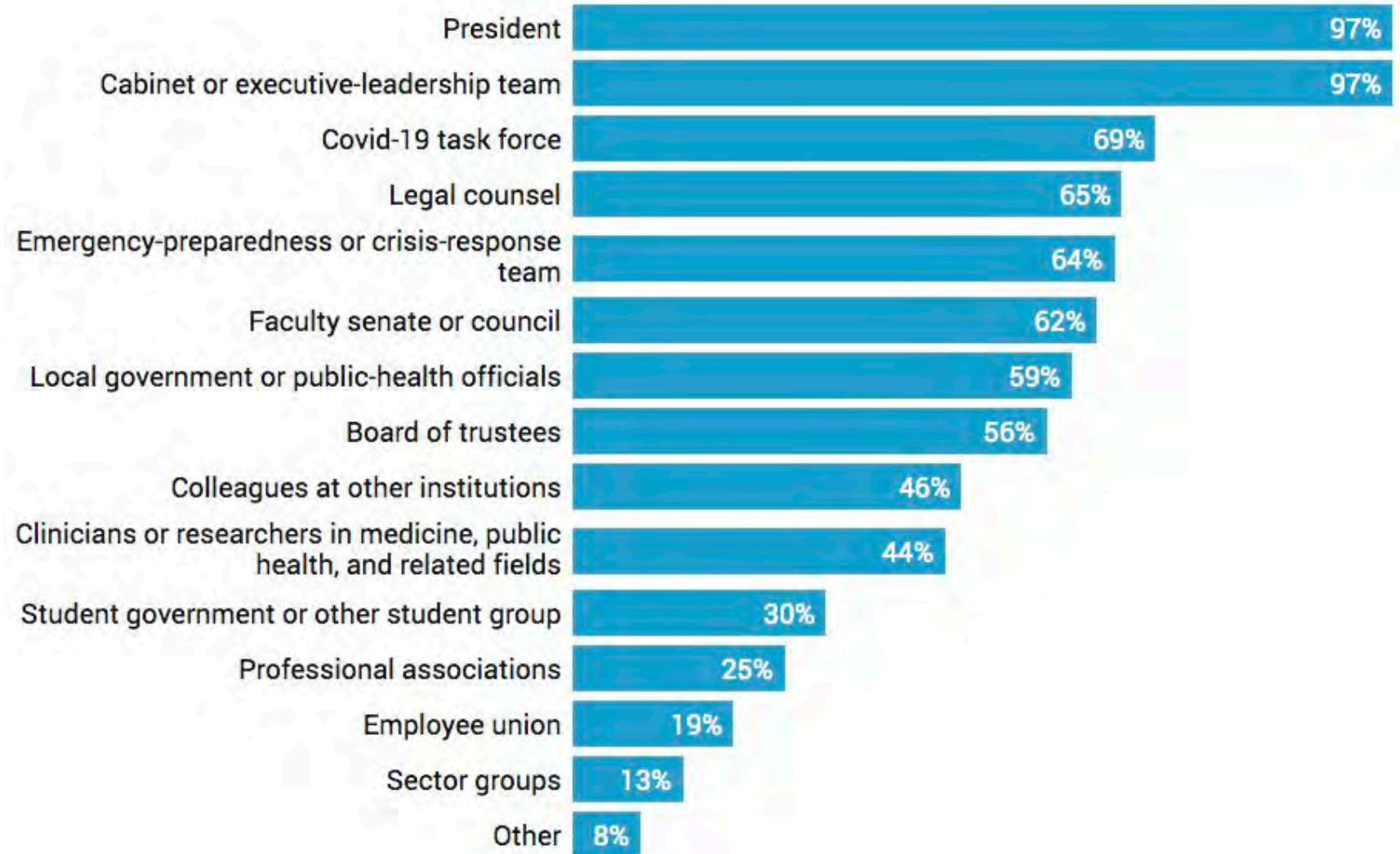
