

## Optimize Your *Chronicle of Higher Education* Site License Access

To ensure your community is receiving access to *The Chronicle's* articles, data, and more, you can take the following steps to confirm that your site license access is optimized:

### 1. ADD THE CHRONICLE TO YOUR CATALOG.

List *The Chronicle* in your library's discovery service/catalog and journal-search records as well as in your database list.

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For discovery/catalog and journal-search records, be sure a direct link to *The Chronicle* is included (not a link to an aggregator like ProQuest or Lexis Nexis), so that your patrons have access to *Chronicle* content as soon as it's published.

### 2. CHECK ANY PROXY SERVERS.

While we encourage our site license account managers to promote IP-based access to *The Chronicle*, we understand that proxy servers allow users to gain access while off campus.

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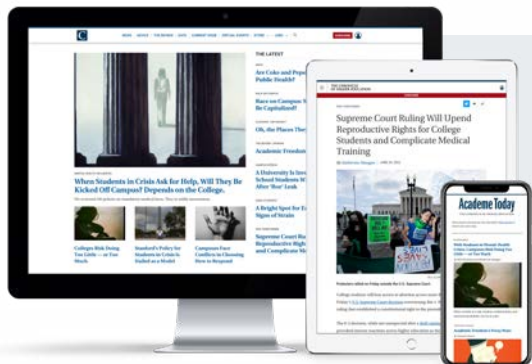
If you are using a proxy server, make sure your users know that they will have to log into that server before gaining access to [chronicle.com](http://chronicle.com).

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If you use Shibboleth, *The Chronicle* is not currently a federation member. Please ensure you also have a proxy server in place, so that your users are getting the most up-to-date information from *The Chronicle*.

### 3. CHECK FOR MISSING IPs.

Confirm that your IP addresses align with what's on file with *The Chronicle*, by emailing [sitelicense@chronicle.com](mailto:sitelicense@chronicle.com).
